

Essential verbs (part 1)

do	It's one of the most frequently used verbs in English and means to act, to perform.
<p>This car does 150 miles per hour. It is so fast.</p> <p>The businessman did a very good job. It was a success.</p>	

go	<p>When you see a green traffic light, what do you do? You go.</p> <p>Go is a word with many different meanings.</p>
<p>Children go to school.</p> <p>If I want to check my email I go online.</p>	

come	This verb means to move, to travel, to get to a particular place.
<p>Winter has come to the city. Everything is covered with snow.</p> <p>The businessman is coming to his office.</p>	

show	This verb means to display something.
<p>A young woman shows pictures with the alphabet. She is teaching online.</p> <p>This woman is looking for a bus station. The local shows her direction.</p>	

see	It is what your eyes do.
<p>Can you see the bird in that tree?</p> <p>He is blind he cannot see.</p>	

hear	You listen to something and hear it.
<p>I can't hear you</p> <p>Do you hear that noise?</p>	

<i>get</i>	It's one of those words with lots of meaning.
This man has got a message, he seems so happy. A businessman is getting money from his pocket.	

<i>put</i>	This verb has many uses and refers to placement. You can put things down or put ideas into words.
The cook puts the fork on the table. I put money in the piggy bank.	

<i>take</i>	This verb has many meanings and is used in lots of English expressions.
People take hotdogs. The businessman is taking notes on paper	

<i>give</i>	As you can take many things, you can give many things.
A businessman gives a business card to his partner. The man gives an engagement ring to his finance.	

<i>think</i>	It's to have an idea, belief, or thought of something.
This man is thinking about new fresh ideas right now. This little girl is thinking hard during class.	

<i>know</i>	As a verb, it means to have a piece of information or a certain understanding of something.
She knows how to entertain herself. He knows everything about wine. He is a wine expert.	

<i>understand</i>	It means to know or get it. The more we learn the more we understand.
The woman understands how to make online payments. The girl doesn't understand something on the computer.	

<i>forget</i>	When you forget something you can't remember it.
This student forgot to save some important project on his computer. Someone forgot to turn off the iron.	

<i>feel</i>	If someone gives you a piece of bad news you'll feel sad.
The woman feels freedom and happiness. The man feels stressed while working.	

<i>wright</i>	It's to put pen to paper or your fingers to the keyboard.
Someone is writing a letter to his lover. Children write letters to Santa.	

<i>read</i>	It's to understand letters and words, making sense of a language.
Someone is reading a book. A businessman is reading a contract.	

<i>tell</i>	It's to describe or announce something, either by speaking or writing.
A woman tells a secret to her friend. The speaker tells (gives) the speech at the conference.	

<i>say</i>	This verb means to deliver your opinion on something.
What are you saying ? This engineer says no.	

<i>Speak</i>	This means to talk actually. If you speak English it means you can communicate in this language.
The doctor speaks on a smartphone in the hospital. This man speaks to his clients.	

<i>wake</i>	This verb means to come out of sleep.
A tired employee wakes up and continues working on the computer. Grey striped Kittens wake up .	

<i>eat</i>	This verb means to consume food, you do it several times a day.
The young panda eats the green leaves of bamboo all day. A woman is eating pizza.	

<i>drink</i>	If you take in liquids like water, juice, alcohol, etc., you - drink.
A young lady is drinking water from a bottle. A woman is drinking coffee.	

<i>leave</i>	This verb means to go away or exit. You can leave the job, the country, or your partner.
High school students leave the bus. Colleagues leave the business center.	

<i>pay</i>	When you pay, you give money in return for something. But it's not always about money.
The man pays online with his credit card. A woman pays money to the realtor and shakes hands.	

<i>buy</i>	When you buy something like food or a car you exchange a certain amount of money for it.
A young woman buys fresh vegetables from a farmer. People buy tickets at the cinema.	

<i>cost</i>	The cost of something is how much money you need to spend on it.
How much does the bouquet cost ? It costs 78 dollars. The woman checks the price of the heels. The shoes cost too much. She is disappointed with the price.	

<i>sleep</i>	If you are tired you probably need to sleep so lie down and close your eyes.
A dog is sleeping on a woman's hand. A woman is sleeping using a sleeping mask.	

<i>begin</i>	When you begin something it means you start something.
A cat begins to eat. Food begins to boil.	

<i>hang</i>	To fasten or support something at the top leaving the other parts free to move.
Someone hangs a Christmas decoration. The girl hangs clothes.
